



The person who has to get up during the riight to pass urine may be suffering from one of two conditions, lays The Canadian Medical Association.

If he is passing larger quantities of urine than normal during the night, and in the daytime too, the doctor will look for such diseases as disbetes and chronic Kidney disease. More commonly, however, the individual who has to get up during the night simply has to pass urine more frequently, and the total quantity is no greater than normal.

In older men, this condition is usually due to enlargement of the prostrate gland, which is located at the lower end of the bladder. In males this gland normally enlarges with age, and sometimes reaches a size large enough to interfere with the ability of the bladder to hold large quantities of urine. It may also interfere with the valve mechanism at the lower end of the bladder, causing the patient to experience difficulty in starting or stopping the urine stream. People with such symptoms should con-
