

mphlet made available recently A pamphier made available receiving through the Digby Branch of the Can-adian Mental Health Association contains some very sound advice for dealing with an occasional emotional upset.

Pointing out that minor emotion Pointing out that minor emoneral upsets are as common as an occasional cold or headachs, the pamphlet does however also provide indications and signs concerning emotional upsets that it should be regarded as signals that it is time to secure help.

In the case of the occasion

In the case of the occasional minor emotional upset the pamphier lists nine suggestions for dealing with the situation. These are detailed as follows:

Talk over your worries with a sympathetic friend, relative, doctor or anyone else whose judgment you respect.

Get away for a while, even if only

Work off your anger, or other tense in some physical activity.

feeling in some physical activity.

Take one thing at a time, especially if you feel overwhelmed by the pressure of too much, to do.

Give in sometimes, even if you are certain that you are right, but face the fect that you might be wrong.

Be slow with criticism; awareness of your own shortcomings and those of others is no excuse for harsh criticism.

Help others; preoccupation with your own troubles can become a victous

Co-operate; this is a competitive so-ciety, but many situations call for a co-operative effort; if you compete all the time, you might be too worn out to enjoy success when you achieve it.

Above all: develop a capacity for Above all, develop a capacity for contentment, take pleasure in your physical well-being, in your surroundings, in the small gratifications of your daily life; learn to enjoy your own company and the companionship of the people you wally care for. really care for.

Home And School

The role of the Home and School is becoming more and more important to the complete education of the child. We are pleased to see that the Home and School organizations on the Islands, at Bear River and Weymouth are away to Beer River and Weymouth are away to a good start for the year 1971-72. Digby District Home and School, as most of our readers have learned, had gone through a few agonies, possibly growing pains, but the future of the Digby H. & S. since Tuesday evening looks promising again.

Only one thing will make the future of Digby District Home and School cer-tain, that is, full parent co-operation. With this in mind we revive some of the thoughts of Gerald J. Doucet, former minister of education, two years ago. He had this to say on Home and School:

"In the present age of progress in technology and increasing travel, the association between home and school must sociation between nome and scrinor must be firm and symphetic, if parents and teachers are to fulfil their respective roles in the education of every school child. Nor are these roles as sharply defined as was previously the case. The teacher, realizing more clearly the need to develop the child's potential, today becomes more involved with factors in his home life Similarly, the modern parent has an important function in the education of his children, which he acknowledges by the formation of a regular means of contact

with the teacher.

The strongest link in the association, The strongest link in the association, of course, is the bay or girl, whose welfare and education are the subject of such deep interest, is it not, then, imperative to continually emphasize at home that education is a worthy end? Children display a great desire to emulate grownups. Their work, and also their play is a constant striving to attain per-sonal maturity. Among adults who influence their impressionable years are their parents and teachers. The latter are greatly helped in their task of instruction greatly helped in their task or instruction by an awareness in the home of the value of education. This can be reinforced ef-fectively by the parent's respect for toleration, clear judgment and social justice — qualities inherent in all honest educational schemes;

Discussion between teachers and Discussion between reachers and parents is excellent. Already the boy or girl senses that education is not as is so often believed, imposed upon the young and immature, but is also a matter of liyely interest to mature adults. The Home and School meeting can afford its mbers the opportunity to learn curriculum innovations of radical of curriculum innovations, or radical changes in testing and examining pro-cedures, and of adjustment in back-ground requirements for further educa-tion. Teacher members may gain a deeper insight into the social and psychological stresses affecting the child outside the walls of the classroom, and may offer wais of the classroom, and may one co-peration with parents in discouraging young people's use of alcohol, cigarettes and drugs which certainly don't contri-bute to the child's educational and social progress

Mr. Doucet endorsed commu between parent and teacher which is ecognized by membership in a Home and School Association, where, he said, and School Association, where, the said, there is a healthy climate for review and discussion. He then declared October to be Home and School Membership Month. This is October 1971. If you haven't taken a long look at your Home and School situation, then do so now.

Continuous Program In Student Education

Beginning in September of the pres-ent year, C. E. Edwards; Inspector of Schools for Digby and Annapolis, began a monthly sewsletter or report to School Bagrds and interested schools similar or reports submitted to the Minister of Education. The report is known as Educa-tion' Annapolis-Digby. All four reports submitted to this newspaper were interest and would be interesting to our readers. prescription within a term — nothing
more, nothing less.

Promotion by grade provides for
the average, pressures low inkinevers and
provides no challenge for pupils of
superior ability. The one most adversely
affected is the slow learner, for him to
do the program of a grade within a term
is likely to be an impossible task, resulting in frustration and defeat.

The effects of non-promotion are
many. It is expensive in relation to time

7. Teachers approach teaching and their

8. Teachers are more relaxed about their work.




