



Now we know that mental illness, like physical - ress, is a disorder of the body, affected by stress. We also know that with early and proper treatment there is hope for recovery from the mental and emittingal disorders. of the mental and emotional disorders. We know also something of the caus-We know also something or the causative factors that operate to produce mental illness and emotional disorder. Already efforts are underway toward the elimination of these factors and toward the oreation of conditions conducive to mental health rather than ill-

No Honor, No Respect?

We stood at the Cenotaph in Diaby on Saturday with very few others except those connected with the parade of ver-erans. Each year the number who attend this Remembrance Day service gets smaller and noticeably so this year, so noticeable that persons from anoth town who visited remarked on so few

Immediately we began to make ex-uses. Many went to the Remembrance Cuses. Many we'n' to the Remembrance Day's service on the preceding Sunday, After all, too, the day was a bit cold, But our visitors would not pass those as legitimate excuses. Those who gave their lives for their country had to endure more than the cold and breeze of that half hour or less on Saturday in embrance at the Cenotaph. And how true they were and how real the service was to them. It was plain to be seen they remembered. Yes, they remember-ed even though it was thirty years ago since the Second World War ended and more than 50 years since the First World

War ended. Their explanation was that there is not left any honor and respect. While wars have been going on in other countries and the armed forces are kept up in Canada, still our children and youth, young men and maidens of today have not been brought up to the today have not been brought up to the ravages and heartbreaks of war. In many cases, being in the armed forces is just dads "job" to young people, for they know little of active service. Those who remember back to the First World War are 'not so young any more and even many of those who remember only the Second World War are now grandfathers and grandmothers. Neither their children nor grandchildren can really comprehend the horrors of war as the older people knew them. Life for this generation has been good. Never had it been so good.

And so one reason for there being so few out to Remembrance Day service on Saturday could be that the older on saturday could be that the older people are growing still older and not in such robust health for November out-door services. Many who witnessed the anxieties of war have passed on and the younger of the day cannot be sex-pected to "remember" what they have not experienced. Honor and respect for the war dead? Yes a man who have the war dead? the war dead? Yes, even the younger people have it to some degree but the deepest feeling is absent because the experience has been absent.

Another reason for so few out to Another reason for so few out to the service could be that we have made "Armistice Day" a holiday instead of a remembrance day. And, what are you likely to do or where are you likely to go on a holiday? Probably not to the Cenolaph.

Remembrance Day and congratulate the Digby Legion on their fine new building and their out-going program. 



Highway Safety Your Business Always

Would you believe in if we told you that the number of highway accidents in Nova Scotia from January to the end of June, 1972, was 6,8147 That number is 603 more than for the same period the year before. Those injured in their period in 1972 were 1,025, or 194 more than 1971. Fatal accidents were down by five and treftic deaths. were down by five and traffic deaths down by five. While the figures show-ing the number of accidents in 1972 are disappointing, the deaths by accident have-decreased and we venture to say that fastened seat belts might have done something towards reducing that figure. When accidents happen, who or

what is to blame? Is it the car, the highwhat is to blamer is it me car, the high-way or the driver? In a survey of 409 fatal single car accident, it was found that 18 percent or 119 were caused by mechanically defective older, vehicles. Most of the crashes occurred on straight, most of the crashes occurred on streight, level, dry roads in clear weather on rural highways. Most of these were caused by speeding. Mrs. Larkin recommends that the de-perment of highways place reflectors on the rails of both exits and mein roads so they can readily be seen by

Our hearts are heavy biscause of his tragic and unfortunate highway so-cidents which have come to our Digby people. This is all the more reason that we continue to remind our readers that December 1 to 7 is Highway Sefety Week, which really extends throughout the winter and entire summer season.

Winter Driving Caution

Drivers should be aware that icy conditions reshould be aware that by conditions require more braking distance and if skidding occurs you should not slam on the brakes. Slowing down or speeding up too quickly cen cause skids. And, remember there is no substitute for caution in winter driving.
