

Tonight the ratepayers of Digby will be asked to approve the proposed bor-rowing by the town of Digby of a sum not exceeding \$850,000 for the purpose of constructing, altering, extending or purchasing materials, machinery, imple ant deemed requisite or advis ents or plant deemed requisite of action able therefor, or for maintaining public sewers or drains.

About fifty attended an information meeting held last Thursday evening and received satisfactory answers to their questions. With more time to study the issue these same people will more than blikely have more questions to pose force they mark "for" for "against" the proposition outlined above. There must o new nundred other people who are interested in wanting to make the right decision by finding out answers to puzzling questions. Too ght is the night to from them out before the vote is taken. Remember, whoever is these be a few hundred other people who are member, whoever is there will 'cast ur vote for you" no matter how you

think. So be there.

The cost factor, of course, is the serious part of the proposition. Unless ou are at the meeting you will not hear

that the Provincial government through the Water Resources will give up to twenty percent of the capital cost for collection and treatment of sewage. The Federal government will loan two-thirds of that cost and totally forgive 25 percent of the loan. Besides, a special fisher ies grant of \$40,000 is obtainable, making an estimated total of \$214,000 ob-tainable through grants or loans by government agencies. By estimating about \$76,000 for frontage revenue the actual amount to borrow on term financ-

actual amount to borrow on term miner-ing is reduced to \$560,000.

Against this borrowing must be weighed the evils of raw sewage run-ning in distness and dangerous to the health of children and adults. Sewage neatin or children and adults. Sawages untreated and running into the water at the shore is dangerous for bathing and for the fish industry, particularly the shellfish industry, in fact, a good sawage system is one of the good factors in drawing industry of any type to an area.





Of the 5,616 traffic deaths in Canada in 1971 there were children under the age of fifteen. Of 1,276 pedestrian fatalities, 478 or 37.5 percent were children under fifteen years of age.

Of 1,064 drownings, 322 or 30.3 cent were children under the age of een. Males outnumbered females about 6 to 1.

There were 647 fire fatalities and 155 or 24 percent were children under the age of ten.

than from the major childhood diseases combined.

Accidents do not just happen. A set of circumstances which frequently with a little foresight, could have been pre-vented, all too often costs a child's life

So Poor An Approach

The Digby Board of Trade has taken up the challenge of urging something different for an approach from High way 1 to the Princess of Acadia terminal. Through Conway, as the road is situated at present, if is hazardous for children using that highway. The turn from Warwick St. to Victoria St. or Victoria to Warwick is a bottleneck at most times and right now an extreme danger. Victoria St., Itself, is narrow and dangerous for pedestrians, particularly when large transports are using that street. It is ed that the Annapolis Valley Affili-I Boards of Trade on Saturday will take up with zest the challenge which the Digby Board has started. Life is too precious to run the risk of dangerous highways anywhere.

Highway I, at the Conway approach, is in the main streamline from Helifax to Yarmouth on the Annapolis Valley route. There are a lot of people Halitax to Tarmourn on the Annapons Valley route. There are a lot of people travelling on that road, hopefully many of whom want to visit in Digby or want to use the ferry terminal. In order to do this, enroute from Yarmouth, the East bound traffic is compelled to stop short at the Conway entrance until West bound traffic, no matter how long a line, has passed. While improvements such as lighting have helped to find the approach at night, this is not the whole answer as can readily be seen as the summer traf-fic starts to increase.

The question which many are now asking after two years, and we agree, is why can't there be an overpass or some construction which will allow a continual flow of traffic as the approaches to other valley towns do. As a Valley man said on Sunday, "It is liard enough for us living here to put up with that approach," but how can our visitors manage.



(a) where the highway is marked with a solid double line, the driver of a vehicle shall drive the vehicle to the right of the line only;

The above shall not apply (a) where a vehicle is entering or leaving the highway at a place other than an intersection; or (b) where a vehicle is completing a passing manoeuver

(c) where the lines are not clearly visible or where it is reasonable and prudent to drive to the left of the lines due to weather or other conditions.

THE REQUIRED 60-DAY WAITING (LEARNING) PERIOD FOR A LICENSED BEGINNER IS CHANGED AS FOLLOWS: A licensed beginner may, while his license is in force, apply to an examiner for a certificate that he has qualified for a driver's license:

No vehicle shall enter a highway and rail-way grade crossing unless there is suf-ficient space on the other side to accom-modate the vehicle he is operating with-out obstructing the passage of railroad

trains. Where sidewalks are provided it shall be unlawful for any podestrian to walk along and upon an adjocent highway. Where sidewalks are not provided any pedestrian walking along and upon a highway shall, when practicable, walk only on the let side of the roadway or its shoulder facing traffic which may approach from the opposite direction.

All motorcycles must be equipped with

Conviction for violation of the line requirements on the highway will result in 2 points being assigned to the driver's record under the "Point System".


