ERNEST HANSELPACKER, OF DIGBY AMONG THE MEN RESCUED BY THE PLEROMA.

(From the New York Herald, Oct. 22)

Captain A. M. King, of the Florence R. Hewson, and two of his men walked into the Ship News office of the Herald, at the Battery, yesterday and told of, shandoning their schooner, which left Mobile on October 4th, with 979 000 feat of lumber bound for Park

which left Mobile on October 4th, with 272,000 feet of lumber, bound for Demerata, British Guiana.

"Will the Herald please report that all hands of the Florence R. Hewson are safe?" began Captain King. "I lost my vessel in that hurricane off Cuba during the worst twenty-four hours that I ever spent in my seafaring life. faring life.

faring life.

"We ran into bad weather as soon as we left Mobile, and on the morning of the 11th the gale was so heavy that I put her under bare poles and scudded before it. At nine o'clock I figured that we were twenty-five miles north northeast from Havana, when a sudden squall broke, and down she went on her beam ends as the deckload shifted.

shifted.

"The seas were running fearfully high and washed her fore and all, but by hard work we managed to cut away the weather lanyards and the masts went by the hoard. The seas had smashed the rudder, and when we righted we were as hall less as a self-the righted we were as helpless as a raft. Two of the men managed to get inside the forecastle, and J. F. King, the mate, and a sailor were washed overboard in trying to reach the cabin. Luckily a wave washed them inboard again and we caught them.

"We found that our largest boat was hanging by a single davit with the bottom stove in, but with canvas we patched the hole, and were about ready to start when the Pleroma, Captain A. F. Foster, with a cargo of cocoanuts, from Cayman Brac for Savannah, hove in sight. The Pleroma had lost sails and was badly wrecked herself, but we managed to reach Key West on the 13th.
