"Why don't they do something about that building?", mean-ing, of course, that the town or munic-pal authorities ahould make it look more presentable. And so we feel, some (not all) of the things demanded and some (not all) of the expressions made during the re-cent school controversy and survey could have been made without too much serious thought as to the right or wrong of the idea, the why and wherefor of the the idea, the why and wherefor of the suggestions or who the "(they" was going to be to meet the monetary obligation. As one person admitted, "I didn't know much about it but I thought if I could be any help, I would" and so she in-nocently joined the ranks.

This gives us the idea that some people (not all) in Digby were not really being malicious but simply non-thinkers in cases such as when the survey re-ported some people to have appeared to be prompted by personal interests which near an concidentia to the well. which gave no consid aration to the wellbeing of the community. Quoting from the report, "At lines it apposed as if the basic needs of the students were often ignored in the conflicting points of vicey expressed by adults and what it still more serious, one stupented that the students themselves were being used and manipulated to add strength to some individual's presentation to the Survey Term." Of course, then to turn the tables around and to return to the "they", you and me, who are paying the shot, then, as the survey emphazized, it is the right of parents, tazpayers and citizens gen-erally to know what the school is doing and why. This has been stimething which

this editor has frequently thought a We recall some years ago being con-vener for a panel at the Nova Scotia Weekly Newspapers Association meeting held in Halifax and the subject of open held in Halifax and the subject of open school board meetings was put on the top of the list by your editor. She wanted to find what went on in the school board newspaper news releases in other parts of the province. We recall having invited Mrs. Helen Anthony, chairman of the Digby Urban School Board, to be on the panel. From the lively panel we dis-covered there were doors closed to the cress in school parts of the province. press in some parts of the province, while they were wide open in others. We favored then and we favor now, the wide open doors

Wide apen doors, of caurse, dewho been dour, of close, de-pends on how responsible is the press. There are often private matters about students or teachers with which Boards must deal but which are nobady else's must deal but which are nobody else's business either via press or private per-son. A responsible press must tell the news, it must be truthful, it must not suppress news but it must also have good taste and respect for human values and human feelings.

Digby School Boards were not open but minute books were. Our complaint had been that while we had never (and we emphasize never) been denied a look at the school board minutes there look at the school board minutes there were few minutes which gave more detail than 'moved by and seconded by ...". This made no news story but on the other hand we knew parliamentary procedure enough to know that these minutes were property taken. Motions and not discussions are recorded, rightly. Now here we come with the survey re-ont successition contrary to our parliaport suggestion contrary to our parlia-mentary training "that the minutes of all School Board meetings be an accurate report of the highlights of all discus-sions, recommendations, and decisions, report of the highlights of all discus-sions, recommendations, and decisions, and not merely a record of motions passed; that the minutes of all School Board meetings include as part of the minutes all reports and recommendations submitted to the Board." Right or wrong, this editor; edit, onigh on arrung agniatt this editor isn't going to argue against that suggestion. We might want to re-nege from a school board meeting and use the full and in detail minutes instead. We heartily endorse the school board open meetings with the certain stipula-tion regarding students and teachers and do not quarrel with "our own brand of parliamentary procedure".

There is another recommendation which we'like. It is "wider use by the community of the school and facilities with as few restrictions as possible." We hearing endorse this with the comment that adually nothing ineeds restrictions unless some foolish person makes an abuve and them but cell for important unless some foolish person makes an abuse and them that calls for imposing restrictions. Abuses are those things which make chaperones and watchmen necessary. What a day when human nature d|mbs to such heights of re-sponsibility that no restrictions need to be imposed.
