

Weekly Press Fulfils Function (National Newspaper Week)

thought in mind that we were to go on CKDY radio Friday mornwere to go on CKDV radio Friday morning, we surriad around to find out how many weekly newspapers there are in Cerado, just in case John Wasterman posed the question of CE-TV one day recently and took a guess at some 500. We were twong. Probably that many belong to the Canadian Weekly Newspaper Association but there are far more than that, really, From a recent report of The CWNA. really. From a recent report of the CWNA president, we find there are actually 900 Canadian weekly newspapers with a total circulation in excess of 2,000,000 and a readership of at least four million to six million, The Digby Courier, Istelf, has a pross run of 3600 approximately, making some 11,000 and more readers.

The CKDY broadcast on Friday re-vealed The Digby Weekly Courier having been established in 1874. Do you know, even that date was 122 years after the first Canadian weekly newspaper, The Hailfax Gazette, was established in 1752? It was two hundred and eighteen years go when that first weekly newspaper came out in Canada. Digby County's first newspaper, the Athenaeum, was established 105 years after the Halifax Gazette. Actually, Digby County had thirteen weekly newspapers printed and published in its own area back through the years, though some were short lived. The names of these newspapers, in order, were the Athenaeum, Acadian, Examiner, The Digby Weckly Courier, Canadian, L'Evangeline, Weymouth Times, The Digby County Record, The Weymouth Gazette when that first weekly newspape

and The Tiny Tattler. Of these, The Digby Courier is the only one which survived by co-operation of readers, advertisers correspondents and daily staff. Without these, no newspaper can survive. The correspondents and daily staff. Without these, no newspaper can survive. The present editor and publisher of the Cour-ler is most appreciative to all of these.







To tell the truth, Canadians in general do not take advantage of the bounty of the tea which is at their doorstep. People in other countries appreciate our fish products

more than Canadians do. Son a of our readers have already noticed in Hodge Podge that confish has become a multi-million dollar industry in the Southern United States. Why can't it the Southern United States. Why can't if happen here? Jihls being National Fish fin' Seafoods month is a good time, however, to bring aftention to the fact that both the Federal and Noiva Social Provincial governments have been trying to work up mor revenue and more employment by making use of what we generally considered trash fish, including life cartish now so valuable in the United States.

One particular study of interest to us in Digby is the variety of seafood products which can be made from our Digby scaleop rose and rims, all of which we have been casting aside fog years,

Just because we didn't get a start Togfish, too, long despised by us, is co Logrish, too, long despised by us, is com-monly used in Europe and its used greatly for fish-and-chip shops in London, Eng-land. We might look linto exporting our dogfish if we don't become so fish hungry or so hungry period that we decide to put them on our menu.

The quentity of scallop rims and roe discarded by fishermen in one year equals the same poundage of scallop muscle which we cat and export.

Wouldn't even let the cat get them?, However, do even let the cat get them?, However, do you remember when any butcher would give away the liver, heart and tongue from their meet shop if anyone was foolish enough to eat them? Or, do you remember when you could buy the whole liver or heart for fifteen cents? Try it to-day and see what you pay. We all know: that commen fish species are becoming scarcer. We had

species are becoming scarcer. We hed better look into other varieties and byproducts for our own consumption and export.

HINTS ON MAKING DOUGHNUTS

Have all ingredients for doughouts at room temperature so that the dough can be mixed quickly to give inner doughbuts. The dough should be just firm enough to handle easily. The softer the dough, the more delicate the texture of the doughnut. Therefore, the dough it me mixed softer than can be annuled and then chilled before rolling and cutting. Yeast doughnuts are made stiff enough to handle since they must rise slightly before being fried.

Aflow the cut doughnuts to dry 10 to 12 minutes on a lightly floured board or absorbent paper before trying so they absorb lets fat during frying. Fry at 360 to 370 degrees.

Never crowd the frying kettle. Replace cooked doughnuts at intervals with uncooked once to keep fat at an even temperature. Place on absorbent paper to drain when cooked.



Those who come to the new council with experience will shoulder the greatest responsibilities, those who come se entirely new at the job will find that it will take months of tedious attention to become well exqualited with those things constituted in their duties. We say "that off" to those willing to throw "thats in the ring".

Having persuaded someone to a council seat and/or voted someone "into office" does not relieve a citizen or "into office" does not relieve a citizen or retepayer of further responsibility. Any-one who takes on the burden of town raffaris does so for the benefit of the whole community. That means you and me, clear town reader. What happens within these town limits is your business and while fedderal, provincial and mun-icipal affairs outside the town affect the town itself and vice vers the chief re-sponsibility of the town lies with the town poole. Ways of showing interest are by attending town council meetings and encouraging those whom we elected. We are all to willing to find fault. A little praise can be most effective.





Whelher it is in academic or vocational training any child can be handicapped because of his inability to grasp the meaning of the written word. He might read words but have no understanding. Therefore, for a child to educate he must first be put in a position to chopprehend and absorb what is in the leat. This sometimes requires beginning from the point where he can comprehend.

All too often a child is considered incapable of attaining in reading or in grades when his whole problem might be that he has never had the advantage.

The child might never have been expor-The child might never have been exposed to the right material to achieve certain standards in reading. He was probably plunged into too difficult reading before he was ready and never did get to the place of comprehension but could only read words.

Farmers Deserve Commendation On Study

The farmers of the Digby area gre to be commended on thair current approach to agricultural problems in the district. The setting up of committees to conduct in-depth studies of factors affecting the various segments of the farming industry in this area is a positive approach to these problems which must first be positively identified if they are to be successfully overcome.

successfully-overcome.

For 'many years, it has been contended that this area is admirably suited
to the production of small fruits and
vegetables and some efforts have been
put forward to demonstrate the validity
of this claim. Contention has also been
made that the area is suitable for beef
and hop production and efforts have been undertaken to develop an agricultural program in this direction.

program in this direction.

Not all of these efforts have begin totally successful. Obstacles have ententhat were not-anticipated, altustoms developed that were unexpected, and even limited success has been accompanied by, fruturations, that have dufied the effectiveness of example. Extranous matters have also been allowed to interfere to the point where distortion of fact seemed to give unjustifiable weight to otherwise rather meaningless conclusions.

The current accordant winderstane has

otherwise rather meaningless conclusions. The current approach undertaken by fermers of the area under the leadership of their district federation of agriculture should do much to overcome these problems. No venture as risky as involvement in the farming industry can be, should be, embarked upon without in-depit study, not only of the benefits but also of the possible pitfalls. The impact of the possible pitfalls. The impact of the possible pitfalls are impact of the possible pitfalls. The impact of the operation of a farming venture need to be studied also. The studies must be receitate and there must be acceptance of their findings even when these are discouraging. Too often blind enthusiaem has substituted for careful ameasment in decisions te embark on ventures that have proven disastrous.

It is not: here contended that, If study shows there are pitfolls, denglers and hard-to-reach requirements in the exhibitions of a given egricultural interprise in the area, it should be shardened. What is suggested is that the studies be undertaken with a yiew to assessing the total situation, exploring all the angles and then determining how best to overcome site difficulties once it has been desided the project is a sound one with a reasonable degree of abusy ance of success.

It is encouraging to note that already the study sessions that have peen held have taken a really hard look in the segment of the agricultural lipidustry they were convened to examine. Acknowledgement has been made of the need for farmers of the area to adopt a famility/dublistic and independent efflusion in their handling of such things as rounded, harvesting and marketing. The in their handling of such things as pro-duction, harvesting and marketing. The need to determine market requirements and to acquire more knowledge of prob-lems to be dealt with in marketing has also been acknowledge. Of vital import-ance aims there has been an acknow-ledgement of the need for greater util-ization of credit provisions available withough apprenament agencies in the ex-pension of the farming industry locally. The difficulties to be overcome because of the small individual farm acreage has been noted also.

It is research may not have been exactly trientifically sound. The newspaper in which I read the story said that he examined 3.416 people, in Louisville, Evensville, Detroit, Loc Angeles, and Snats Morrice, by questioning them on what they had been thinking about during the previous five minutes. The paper, unfortunately, gave no hint of how many times he asked this — only once, or once a day, or once an hour, or in five minute intervals. How long did the carry, on the surgey? — for one week? a month? a year, or longer? And how did hê do it? — letter? by personal interview? did the subjects keep disruer of hint inthoughts? How did he doose his subjects, and how much did they know about the experiment?







Scow-way Safety

Highway Safety Week coming up turns our attention to various types of traffic safety. Seldom do we think of highway safety without considering car scidents but two other could-be hazards were brought to our minds this week by means of conversation with another who was deeply concerned.

The first patter in the conversation was prompted by the long delay in getting Victoria Bridge over Bear River replaced. No one had exactly condemned the bridge, no one goes over it in fear and trembling but the fact remains that the bridge has been there for a long time and as our conversationalist remark-cul "bridges not as old as that one have collapsed." Besides insking the road more convenient and comfortable to accom-modate our ever increasing traffic, the safety factor of that bridge should be given thought. With a new forry service from Saint John 16 Digby, with the Bards of Trade trying to induce more traffic, especially heavy traffic, over the bridge to the ferry, it is high time a decision on the Bear River crossing be made and replacement of the bridge be-gun. True, a structure of any nature needs to be thought out carefully, for its going ne and as our conversationalist remark to be thought out carefully, for it is going to be there for a long time. Hopefully, the delay will not stretch out to months

and or years until a serious accident oc-curs. Granville Ferry bridge was not far away. A school bus had, gone across minutes before the seemingly steady structure collapsed, Anybody remember how short a time it took to build a causeway?

how short a time It took to build a course way?

Another means of transportation was brought to our minds. Often we've urged a permanent crossing from East Ferry to Tieveton. Our resions have been stated on that score. Some upgraded transportation should be made available if there is to be a long delay of bridge or causeway there. The suggestion has been a self-propelled ferry. Our attention has been directed to the Grand Passage, however, and the fact that school, sudents are transported across there over school day. The safest and best possible convenience should be made available or that route. Again, no one looks for an accident, and with every good judgment due the operations of the ferry there has not been an accident. The answer has has not been an accident. The answer h often been given that the cost of a bridge or causeway over Petite Passage bridge or causeway over Petite Peassege is prohibitive for the number of persons it would serve. Looking at Grand Peassege, who can name any price on the loss of a number of school children? Let's not wait to make improvements until a tragedy does occur. Let's be preventive.

Play Safe With Train

Safe-Driving Week takes place dur-ing that period of the year when rollway-highway level crossing accidents are most frequent

most frequent.

Level crossing accidents account for
less than one per cent of all traffic accidents but the Canada Safety Council
points out that they have the high fatality rate of one for every four accidents. The highway death rate is one for every 113

accidents.

Canada's motorists have the main role to play in reducing railway-highway level crossing accidents which killed 120.

Canadians and injured 519 in 1969. A cecent study conducted by the Canada Safety-Council, the railways and the Canada adian Transport Commission concluded that driver error is the greatest single suse of level crossing accidents.

The joint Canada Safety Council realway - Canadian Transport Commission study referred to above concluded that the cost of the ideal solution to these accidents, the elimination of all level crossings, is prohibitive. However, more

accidents, the climination of all lovel crossings, is prohibitive. However, more and more are being eliminated or equipped with automatic warring davices.

The installation of reflectorized crossing signs and freight car markers is increasing their visibility at right. To support the level crossing safety campaign, a colour slide presentation with sound was prepared in French and English for the Carnada Safety Council by the Railway Association of Canada. 



The picture lwss anything but pretty, but the whole pictent was one of misery, distress and horribleness. How could there be anything to represent it except a horror picture?

about the kids in the horror picture, about the kids in the horror picture, "They're the unlucky ones. The kids who have played with drugs. They lost. They've gone from the so-called soft stuff like merijians to the hard stuff. They're hooked — bad." The advertisement went in to say that "unless something is do these kids will become totally useless to highnselves and society within five years. Maybe less." What a terrible fate for society. Can you imagine anything so horrible as a lot of youngsters growing up useless to themselves and society?

Maybe it is only by exposing the worst side of the situation that young people will become wise to themselves. It is, often through Ignorance that these kids can be led.

Bendix goes on to tell what can be done. To the teen-ager the advertisement warns, take a long hard look at the losers (in the picture). To the parent, Bendix says (1) Sar a good example by not abusing drugs yourself—or alcohol; (2) Learn as much as you can about the character and effects of drugs; (3) If you learn no is peddling drugs notify the

To parents in Digby who what to

know more about drugs we suggest you contact the Digby Mental Health Association for pamphilets. It might be surprising what there is to learn, especially for the young people. One teenager, for instance, when exposed to the contents of the pamphilets was surprised to know there were fines and sentences for possession of and/or selling of non-medical drugs.

The Royal Bank of Canada Monthly The Royal Bank of Canada Monthly latter for September 1968 had a helpful article on "Muses of Drugs: Some Fack." They too suggested that unawerness of danger about use of drugs causes much distress. People, the letter states, are unaware of the serious danger to their personality that can result from habituation, or even the smallest uncontrolled experiment with psychoactive drugs. A paragraph daling with marijuans asys the principal effect of marijuans is upon mid." ("it's continued use produces the mind, "It's continued use prod pronounced mental deterioration in many pronounced mental enerroration in many cases . . . It may cause dangerous dis-tortion in time, space, motion and be-haviour. It may give rise to violant, ag-gressiveness and uncontrolled violence." One could scarcely say that mariluana is

As the Monthly Letter states, drug abuse is not something which effects individuals only: it has an effect on society. There is no doubt about the need for education both for parents and for teenagers. Parents need the proper education which they can pass on to their children. As the Letter inlimates, "Most healthy young people see through the filmsy logic of the drug appeal when the facts are presented to them."

Horror factics (even if the truth is horrible) might not be the pleasantest method, but if might be the only method open to save the kids from self-destruction. As the Monthly Letter states,

Two things prompt us to write this aditorial supporting a Home For The Aged in the Digby area. One is simply emotional after visiting some of Digby's aged in an institution some thirty-five miles away. If a Home were in Digby there would be familiar faces of both family and long-time friends to drop in to say "hello". It is pathetic to hear some-'faminy according to say "hello". It is pathetic to recondenses y "I'm so lonesome, nobody cares artymore" as they stare at four strange walls of a strange building.

What a lovely situation there was one time when elderly people could be given a home in the house of the young-say-non or a loving daughter and how fortunate are the few today who do enloy such circumstances. But, alsa, society, housing and way of life in the 1970's is for year few constructed for that type of living. In most cases the younger clative has to be odt to earn a living today, in the case of some 80's and 90's there are no really near relatives around. And while to live with a relative might have been ideal in the 1870's. It is necessary to conform with change in the 1970's. But, it must be hard for a mentally alert elderly person to be suddenly uprooted so entirely from the familiarity of 80 or 90 years. Just put yourself in another's place in imagination even if you are helpless to correct the situation. gay such circumstances. But, alas, society you are helpless to correct the situation.

All of us should be realizing that each year is one year closer to 80 and 90


