Bicycle With Care - Rodeo Helps

With this in mind and knowing that children can be taught safety rules that children can be faught safely rules we commend the Digby Kiwanis sponsored bloycle rodeo for Digby's Natal Day. This is in connection with the Nova Scotia Highway Safety Council program.

This was one cause of bike accidents compounded with a child's lack of knowledge of traffic rules and understanding of the bike's capabilities.

All of these feators, said Mr. Delbridge, added up to the total reason why parents and educators should be urged to enroll their children in such a safety course.



Manufacturars' deliveries of autumn Manufacturers' deliveries of autumn aportswear and women's dresses may be delayed due to a shortage of factory labor, Basil Jackson reports in The Finan-cial Post. The Canadian garment industry is having trouble finding enough skilled workers to operate sewing machines, cut cloth and finish garments. Key factors, Jackson says, are these: After a 10 Jackson says, are these: After a 10 month 12 month slowdown in the industry, order books have filled up for autumn and winter lines. Many workers left the industry. Now there's a problem





Basic School Tools For Continuous Progress

It was with interest we read in the Annapolis Spectator a couple of weeks ago an article by John C. Johnson, Supervisor Annapolis Royal School Subdealing with the Continuing System, dealing with the Continuing Progress System in that school. We be-lieve other schools are using a similar system including some, if not all, the schools within the Digby Municipality and town, We just happened to notice Mr. Johnson's article.

Mr. Johnson gave two subject fields mainly Involved in Continuous Progress whereby the pupil does the work re-quired for a unit or level in accordance with his or her ability, needs and inter-est. The two main subject fields involved, Mr. Johnson said, are Language Arts and Mathematics. The Language Arts, he remarked, features an integrating reading. speaking, listening and writing approach and he especially mentioned the work and he especially menitoned the work done in this regard by the Supervisor of Curriculum, Keith Chappell. These are the basic tools by which the pupil will progress and achieve in other subject fields and in any vocation or occupation which he wishes to pursue, Mr. Johnson wrote in his article. Reading, speaking, listening and writing. With a few years' teaching experience behind us and some little ex-perience in such subjects as writing and speaking, we can readily see where all these integrated subjects, now known as these integrated subjects, now known as Language Arts, are so important to a basic foundation for other subjects. 
