Dr. ols we tend to emphasize the child's schools we tend to emphasize into thind a weaknesses rather than this strengths by giving him lengthy exercises in his poor areas. This reinforces inadequocies and causas a dislike for school. Dr. Tilemans advocated children

helping each other with their work. When this is not done a valuable toach-ing aid is destroyed. Children often make more effective teachers as they

communicate in their own "jargon" and do not get bogged down in theoretical explanations

explanations, It should be noted that while some of the children at the workshop had some minor difficulties, none displayed marked learning disabilities but all had obvious strengths, Why then, asked Dr. Tilomans, should these children have Tilomans, should these children have any difficulty in school? He suggested that we should do some careful thinking about a system which transforms minor difficulties into major learning blocks and healthy, happy, intelligent/children into frustrated, tremorous children with léarning problems.

It was pointed out that our schools are compatition oriented to a very high degree. The child who answers most quickly, finishes his work first, or prints most neatly is the child who receives awards and yet it is known that past a awards and yet it is known that past a certain point the quality of a person's work degenerates in proportion to the degree of competition. It was suggested that we should encourage competition with oneself (trying to improve one's performance) rather than competition are different and, therefore, unequal in their ability to do a given two are different and, merefore, unequal in their ability to do a given task. Competi-tion between unequals is grossly in-human and unfair, it was stated.

price. But, there are those who can pay only part of that fee. The service is not denied because of this. There are those denied bezeute of mis. There are mose who cannot pay anything but the service is not denied even if the remuneration is nil. However, the expenses of the Board in nurse's salary, car expense, etc., con-triue the same. This is where the public is acked to subsidize by their generous contribution to the upkeep of the Order in our midst.

School health care has been taken over by government department but pre-natal and post-natal care is still a service performed by the V.O.N. All service performed by the V.O.N. is under the advice of a qualified medical doctor.

The question to be asked is, can we afford to do with-out the V.O.N. or had we better dig deeper for its support.
